The school's mission is to provide students with an outstanding education, rich with relevant academic, application and leadership experiences - using healthcare as a theme. Teachers are experts in their discipline and use project-based units that integrate healthcare topics with California state standards. This integrated curriculum combines academics and the health sciences helping to engage students by demonstrating real life applications through the use of healthcare issues, practices and processes. In addition to learning about the importance of high academic and behavioral achievement, students also have numerous opportunities to interview healthcare professionals and visit healthcare settings through explorations and guided study tours.
